<input type="checkbox"/> TRACK 1	<p>Select this track if you want to receive compensation only for your time spent in segregation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - All claimants eligible to a share of the Aggregate Damages will receive the same pro rata amount. The share has been calculated at \$5,469.85 CAD. - Note that, if eligible, you may also receive compensation for time spent in administrative segregation that qualifies per the Track 2 Box 1 process (below). If you are selecting Track 1, you will be automatically considered for Track 2 Box 1, should you be eligible. The exact amount you will receive will therefore depend on the number of days spent in segregation as well as how many class members made a claim. - Track 1 is expected to be the simplest and fastest track. - You will not have to go to court, submit any additional documentation other than this Track Selection Form. - You will have to pay 15 % to your lawyers of any amount received above your share of the aggregate damages
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<input type="checkbox"/> TRACK 2	<p>Select ALL that may apply for Track 2:</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Track 2 Box 1: You were placed in administrative segregation for more than fifteen (15) consecutive days either on or after March 3, 2011 or July 20, 2009 if you satisfy the Seriously Mentally Ill Class definition; and/or</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Track 2 Box 2: You satisfy the Seriously Mentally Ill class definition; and/or</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Track 2 Box 3: A placement in administrative segregation caused or contributed to any of the following particular harms: post-traumatic stress disorder, major depressive disorder, self-injurious behavior, substantial degradation in Axis I Disorder (excluding substance use disorders), or substantial degradation of Borderline Personality Disorder (“BPD”).</p> <p><i>*For clarity, you may select Box 1, Box 2, and/or Box 3 if you are selecting Track 2.</i></p> <p>Please select the Court that you want to hear your case:</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Superior Court of Ontario – select only if you have been placed in administrative segregation either:</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">a) outside Quebec on or after July 20, 2009 (if you satisfy the Seriously Mentally Ill Class definition) or otherwise on or after March 3, 2011 or;</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">b) in Quebec between July 20, 2009 (if you satisfy the Seriously Mentally Ill Class definition) or otherwise March 3, 2011 and February 23, 2013;</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Superior Court of Quebec – select only if you have been placed in administrative segregation in Quebec on or after July 20, 2009 (if you satisfy the Seriously Mentally Ill Class definition) or otherwise on or after March 3, 2011.</p>	<p>Select Track 2 if you want to make a claim for up to \$50,000 CAD for psychological or physical harm caused by your placement in administrative segregation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A medical expert will assess your claim. - It will require additional submissions and may involve answering questions from a lawyer. - The medical expert will recommend an amount for your compensation and the Court will have to approve this recommendation. - If you are eligible to a share of the aggregate damages, you will get at least as much money as you would under Track 1 but it is also possible you may not get any extra money. - You will have to pay up to 15% to your lawyers on money received other than your share of the Aggregate damages, which will be subject to the Court’s approval.
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Select this track if you want to make a claim for more than \$50,000 CAD for harm caused by your placement in administrative segregation.

- A judge will assess your claim.
- A medical expert will assess your claim
- It will require additional submissions and will involve Court appearances and answering questions.
- If you are eligible to a share of the Aggregate damages award, you will get at least as much money as you would under Track 1. However, you will only get more money if the Court approves your claim for additional harm.
- You will have to pay legal fees on the extra money obtained to your lawyers as agreed, which will be subject to the Court's approval.

 - b) in Quebec between July 20, 2009 (if you satisfy the Seriously Mentally Ill Class definition) or otherwise March 3, 2011 and February 23, 2013;
- Superior Court of Quebec** – select only if you have been placed in administrative segregation in Quebec on or after July 20, 2009 (if you satisfy the Seriously Mentally Ill Class definition) or otherwise on or after March 3, 2011.

ATTENTION: Please note that the share of the Gross Aggregate Damages Award (GADA) will be credited for Track 2/3 payments, if eligible.

If your Track Selection Form is not returned within 90 days, your claim may be processed under Track 1.
